CONSUL GENERAL JAMORALIN MEETS FILIPINO COMMUNITY IN WISCONSIN, LEADS CONSULAR OUTREACH SERVICE TEAM

Chicago, 26 March 2018 – In line with the Consulate General’s mission of promoting programs aimed at enhancing people-to-people ties between the Philippines and the US Midwest, Consul General Gina A. Jamoralin spoke before leaders and members of the Filipino community in Wisconsin last Saturday at the start of the consular outreach service at the Philippine Cultural and Civic Center.

She highlighted the upcoming 12th Ambassadors’ Tour and encouraged everyone to rediscover their ties with the Philippines and enjoy the country’s world-class tourist destinations to be featured in this year’s tour in Cebu and Bohol.

The outreach team, which she led, rendered a total of 92 services, including the processing of 40 passport applications, 13 dual citizenship applications and 32 overseas voting registration applications.

The Consul General urged Filipinos and Filipino Americans, who are qualified to vote, to exercise their civic right and duty to participate in the electoral processes as a sign of their commitment to democracy and as a means of having their voice heard.
